## Faculty, Students and Curriculum

This is somewhat old news to some of you regarding leadership and faculty news. We have two new deans. Don Bender has begun his role as the interim dean for VCEA and Ron Mittelhammer has returned to the dean position at CAHNRS from his interim term as co-provost. The VCEA dean search has started. Ron Mittelhammer has also announced there will be CAHNRS dean search following the VCEA search, although there is no timeline for that process.

Phil Gruen will be stepping down as the director of SDC at the end of his contract in May 2017. Phil intends to apply for sabbatical in fall 2017 and is looking forward to returning to teaching and research and helping the school in whatever way he can. A search for a new director will not be initiated immediately, but rather to appoint an interim for 2017-18.

On the Interior Design program front, Matt Melcher will be stepping away, for one year, returning 8/1/17 to take advantage of a professional opportunity. Good luck Matt!

As part of a new course, Construction Management (CM) and Hospitality Business Management (HBM) students toured Guerdon Enterprises in Boise on Sept. 9 to learn about the modular construction process for hotel units that will be part of WSU's new Marriott Courtyard Hotel. Navin Dimond ('85), the founder and CEO of Stonebridge Companies, initiated this industry-sponsored, interdisciplinary course between CM and HBM.
