Studio Highlights

Sophomores developed an innovative design for a Palouse Dryland farming museum and heritage site in Pullman using only analog rendering skills.

Juniors worked with the Wind River Trust (in Skamania County) to re-imagine and restore a former U.S. Forest Service ranger station and tree nursery established early in the 20th century. The class engaged with community members to generate designs that restored historic buildings, maintained the character of the site, and created economic opportunities for local residents.

Seniors partnered with senior Architecture and Interior Design students to expand on the Pullman /WSU gateway project led by Steve Austin in Spring 2020. Student work was shared with and celebrated by WSU Administration and multiple community partners in Pullman.

We are grateful to landscape architecture practitioners and community partners for their time and insights this semester.
